Stonewall's learning packs can be used by parents or carers looking to support their child's learning, by education staff looking to send work home for their students or by teachers in school. This is the SEND/ASN/ALN version of the packs, feel free to mix and match activities from this pack with activities from our mainstream Primary and Secondary packs. Choose the activities to suit the needs of your students.







#### Activities:

- Make a poster about love.
- Read the <u>e-book</u> about LGBT pride and what LGBT means.
- Read the e-book about LGBT role models in computing and science
- Design a costume that someone could wear in a pride march or whilst joining in with a digital pride event. Use collage materials on the person outline.
- Make a musical instrument that could be used at a pride event using junk modelling materials. Use the musical instrument communication mat if needed.
- At LGBT pride events in the UK, there are often performances from famous pop stars. Choose a song by Britney Spears, Ariana Grande, Years and Years or The Pet Shop Boys.
  - Make up a dance to the song
  - Play a musical instrument to the song
  - Use the communication mat to communicate about the song
- Try using a new app or playing a new computer game. Review the app or game using the sheet in the resource pack or using the communication mat.
- What do we use technology for? Go on a hunt around school, college or your house and tick the items off the bingo board that you can find.
- Practice writing the names of the different LGBT role models trace, copy or write their name on the sheet.
